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## HOW TO GET TO THE CONFERENCE VENUE

Distance from Dublin Airport: 17 kms.

By Car: Private transfers can be arranged from Dublin Airport via our agent Una Miley (email: [una@atoi.ie](mailto:una@atoi.ie)).
