INSOL International Taskforce 2021

The Working Groups have continued their work on the different Taskforce objectives and a number have moved towards implementation. We established 20 Working Groups in 2017 as work has progressed a number of these have merged together to provide a more cohesive Working Group (WG) looking at all aspects on a particular subject. A case in point is the merger of WG1 tasked with reviewing overall membership and G36 models including value proposition and WG2 tasked with identifying and promoting additional opportunities for the G36 members. This combined WG chaired by Marcus Ayres, EY, Sydney and Mark Craggs, Fellow INSOL International, Norton Rose Fulbright, London has already moved to implementation stage on various ideas including organising the G36 Younger Members event



highlighted on the front page of this report. A second one is due to take place later this year. The WG is also developing a series of podcasts.

Highlighting the key developments since our last report WG5 who were to review/develop communications channels e.g. the website, App and social media working closely with the Secretariat we saw the launch of the new INSOL website in April this year. INSOL is now looking to develop an App and social media presence and has started to use Tweets and LinkedIn to create greater brand awareness.

WG 6&7 have merged as their remits were similar. They are tasked with enhancing the involvement and relevance of the small practice network and expanding the range of small practice technical products. One of the key suggestions of the WG was to have a representative on the INSOL Board. A number of nominations were put forward and Peter Sargent was appointed to the Board in order to see whether this does give greater presence to the smaller practices. A new bi annual newsletter is ready to be launched and a series of podcasts on subjects of interest to smaller practices.

WG8 were investigating the idea of developing a Legislative Colloquium. We held an inaugural meeting in New York on the 1 May 2018 kindly hosted by Davis Polk & Wardwell and attended by 20 attendees some by a live video link, from 14 different countries. We also had representation from UNCITRAL, IAIR and World Bank Group. Around 50% had a role in drafting legislation, the others role was more regulatory.

The object was to explore what issues are on their legislative/regulatory agenda and if there is an appetite for another forum, run by INSOL, for legislators and regulators. We were conscious that there are other similar forums operating successfully and that our intention was not to compete with them. The outcome was that they felt there was a gap that was not completely filled by other forums. In particular, they wanted some (limited) opportunity to discuss issues with practitioners that were involved in the legislation drafting process and agreed that a forum which allowed regulators, legislators, drafters and other interested parties to discuss law reform would be valuable.

It was agreed that future attendance should be by invitation only, to manage the balance of the group. A second legislative Colloquium will take place in Singapore in tandem with INSOL Singapore.

WG15 were designing and implementing a Judicial training college and curriculum and this was launched with the World Bank earlier this year with our first joint training programme under this auspice in Vietnam and a further one will be held in Zambia later this year.

WG16 who explored the concept of an online international course and now handed over the project to a core committee who are in the process of developing the programme which will be launched in 2019.

Other WG's move steadily forward with their objectives and we expect implementation of additional ideas in the latter half of this year and we are also starting to put together the final working Groups for the second phase of the Taskforce 2018 additional objectives. These have been reviewed and a number of the issues will be brought into some of the current WG's and we will establish a smaller number of new WG's.

The Thing about Schemes in the Scheme of Things: Recognition of Schemes of Arrangement under Chapter 15 of the U.S. Bankruptcy Code

Chapter 15 of the United States Bankruptcy Code (the "Code") allows the foreign representative of an eligible debtor to seek recognition of the debtor's "foreign proceeding" in the US courts. Whilst U.S. bankruptcy courts have routinely recognised schemes of arrangement, it is arguable that a scheme in its various forms, may not strictly qualify as a "foreign proceeding"

under Chapter 15. Questions arise, for example, as to whether a scheme is a "collective proceeding" when each class must be schemed separately; and whether the assets and affairs of the debtor are in fact "subject to control or supervision by a foreign court" in a scheme.

The New Insolvency & Bankruptcy Code in India: Impact on the Distressed Debt Market

The Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, 2016 (IBC 2016) was introduced in India on 1 December 2016. It is seen as one of the most significant economic reforms in the history of the country, with the objective of consolidating and amending the laws relating to re-organisation; ensuring insolvency resolution in a timely manner for the maximisation of the value of assets; promoting both entrepreneurship and the availability of credit; and balancing the

interests of all stakeholders.

Cross-Border Insolvency in Singapore: The Effectiveness of the Judicial Insolvency Network and the JIN Guidelines on the Administration of Cross-Border Insolvency Matters

The adoption of the UNCITRAL Model Law on Cross-Border Insolvency, the creation and inaugural conference of the Judicial Insolvency Network (JIN) and the formulation of the Guidelines for Communication and Cooperation between Courts in Cross-Border Insolvency Matters developed by the JIN (the Guidelines) represents a concerted effort by both the legislature and the judiciary of Singapore to create a place for Singapore as a leading regional hub for

international debt-restructuring, insolvency and corporate rescue.

Special Reports

A special report entitled 'PRC Enterprise Bankruptcy Law and Practice in China: 2007 to a record-breaking 2017' was published in January 2018, and was emailed out to all members. It was written by Prof. Wang Xin Xin, Dean of Bankruptcy Law Research Centre of Renmin University, Beijing; Prof. Xu Yang Guang, Vice Professor of Renmin University, Beijing; and Mr Alan CW Tang, Head of SHINEWING Specialist Advisory Services, Hong Kong, PRC.

The Enterprise Law of the PRC came into effect in 2007. Since then, it has been observed that the progress made so far has been staggering with a record number of bankruptcy cases being filed and various new initiatives that have been introduced. To achieve this success, the PRC Government, private sector officials, academics, and insolvency practitioners have all cooperated in full and contributed significantly. Since 2008, the PRC Supreme People's Court together with several other organisations has been jointly organising a Bankruptcy Symposium annually to provide a platform where the insolvency and related professionals could discuss matters of interest in an open forum.

This paper discussed some of the key issues that were discussed at the 8th Symposium which includes – the judicial interpretation of the law; analysis of the reasons as to why bankruptcy is not used in the PRC; the development of the administrator system and the bankruptcy reorganisation and practice including cross-border considerations.

This Special Report on MSME insolvency, titled "Restructuring Options for MSMEs and Proposals for Reform", a project that emanates from the INSOL Small Practice Group.

The report consists of ten country chapters. Overall these country studies show that irrespective of whether a country is an emerging economy or a developed one, the insolvency of MSMEs are taken seriously by the governments due to the significant economic contributions made by such enterprises. In countries where the laws are not developed reforms are being considered. This is also high on the agenda of the World Bank and UNCITRAL. Although this project is INSOL International's first foray into MSME insolvency and restructuring, it is unlikely to be the last.

A number of INSOL members have generously given their time and expertise in contributing to this project. We would like to thank all the authors who have contributed to this publication. We trust that you will find this report both informative and useful.

Ian Fletcher International Insolvency Law Moot 5-8 February, Vancouver, Canada

In collaboration with INSOL International, International Insolvency Institute, QUT and the Peter A. Allard School of Law at the University of British Columbia (UBC) presented the second Ian Fletcher International Insolvency Law Moot Competition (the Fletcher Moot) on 5-8 February 2018 in Vancouver, Canada. A moot is a mock appeal hearing used as a well-established means of training law students in case preparation and advocacy skills. The 2018 competition again attracted wide international interest, with law schools from four continents competing. Following a written submission qualifying round, judged by international experts, 8 teams made it into the preliminary oral rounds, held at the University of British Columbia (UBC). The students came from Australia, Canada, China, India, Singapore and the United States of America. Experts in international insolvency law drawn from the ranks of retired judges, senior lawyers and professors from a wide range of common law and civil law jurisdictions volunteered to assess each team's performance in their written and oral presentation skills. Four teams reached the semi-finals – from the National University of Singapore, the Singapore Management University, UBC and the University of Queensland (UQ). These students appeared in the elegant surrounds of the Court of Appeal in Vancouver, before judges including Geoffrey Morawetz and Barbara Romaine (Canada), Paul Heath (New Zealand), Nicoleta Nastasie (Romania), Robert Drain (USA) and Daniel Carnio Costa (Brazil).

The winner of the 2018 competition was the home team from the University of British Columbia, [Adrian Armstrong, Alison Colpitts, Dan Franconi and Maxime Doyle] with the University of Queensland (UQ) being the runner up [Jonathan Hohl, Tessa Boardman and Georgia Bills]. Both teams presented their arguments before the final panel of senior judges - Justice David Tysoe, Court of Appeal, BC Canada, Justice Ignacio Sancho, Supreme Court of Spain and Judge Louise Adler, US Bankruptcy Court - in the Court of Appeal.

Other teams in the final rounds were from the Chicago Kent College of Law, USA; the China University of Political Science and Law; the University of Alberta, Canada; and the West Bengal National University of Juridical Sciences, India.

The award for the best submission in the initial written submissions round went to the team from UQ. However, it must be acknowledged that the most demanding part of any moot competition is the oral presentation to the appeal court. Individual awards were given for this important feature of mooting skills. The best individual mooter in the final oral round was Alison Colpitts of UBC. The best individual mooter in the preliminary rounds was Jonathan Hohl of UQ. These outcomes illustrate the high quality of the final presentations from each team before the appeal judges. Ms Colpitts now has the opportunity to visit UNCITRAL in New York or Vienna to observe the experience of the secretariat members during a session of Working Group V - Insolvency. The Spirit of the Moot Awards were given to Shailja Agarwal and Utkash Agrawal, both of West Bengal National University of Juridical Sciences.


