

Ilya Kokorin, PhD candidate at Leiden University, The Netherlands

Biographical note

Ilya Kokorin is finalising his PhD at the Department of Financial Law at Leiden University. His research focuses on insolvency of multinational enterprise groups and the role of intra-group financial arrangements in restructuring of corporate groups, including banking groups. He is also interested in disruptive technologies (e.g. blockchain), and how they affect and transform commercial practices and rules of property, financial, private international and insolvency law.

Ilya's PhD was preceded by a two-year lectureship in comparative corporate and international insolvency law at Leiden University. Prior to that, Ilya had studied in Russia, Hungary and the Netherlands and worked as an associate at national and international law firms.

Ilya is a member of Young Academics Network of Insolvency Law of INSOL Europe, NextGen IX class of the International Insolvency Institute, Young Researchers Group of the European Banking Institute and a committee member of the Early Researcher Academics (INSOL ERA) of INSOL International. He coaches Leiden University teams in the Ian Fletcher International Insolvency Law Moot.
