Challenges of Modern Insolvency Law

Located in the heart of the Caucasus, Tbilisi is one of Europe's oldest capitals. Tbilisi has been the cultural, economic, educational and political center of Georgia for about 15 centuries. The historic part of the city, Old Tbilisi, was built during the early Middle Ages and is known for its unique architecture.

Georgia is one of the leading tourism destinations in the region and one of the oldest wine-producing countries in the world. The vessel that is included on the UNESCO Representative List of the Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity, as is the Georgian alphabet, which is one of the world's 14 alphabets.



The Georgian saying 'Every guest is a gift from God' sums up how hospitable, upbeat and inviting the Georgian people are.



Business Rehabilitation and Insolvency Practitioners Association was established in 2018 by leading insolvency professionals, thanks to the support USAID, with the aim of creating a functional insolvency system in Georgia. BRIPA became a key advocate for insolvency reform and contributed to the drafting of the new Law on Rehabilitation and Collective Satisfaction of Creditors. The new Law entered into force on April 1, 2021, fundamentally changing the country's approach to insolvency. The Georgian Government actively collaborated with USAID's Economic Governance Program to create a cadre of professional and authorized insolvency practitioners in Georgia. Currently there are 18 authorized insolvency practitioners, all members of BRIPA. This year is the first time Georgia is hosting a regional conference, including international delegates. The conference will mark Georgia's place on the global insolvency systems reform map and will give the country the chance to be part of global developments and proposals to address ongoing challenges in the field. The two-day conference offers all delegates an amazing opportunity to engage in discussions led by outstanding international and regional experts. Comparison of insolvency systems in different countries, the court's role in implementing successful practices, blockchain, and digitalization as a challenge for modern insolvency systems are the main topics for the conference. The conference is one of the main activities among the ongoing project implemented by BRIPA and fully supported by USAID Economic Governance Program in collaboration with Commercial Law DevelopmentProgram (CLDP). The project aims to facilitate the effective and successful implementation of the reform and the existence of a strong professional association.
